— Therefore sent he thither horses, and chariots, and a great host: and they came by night, and compassed the city about.

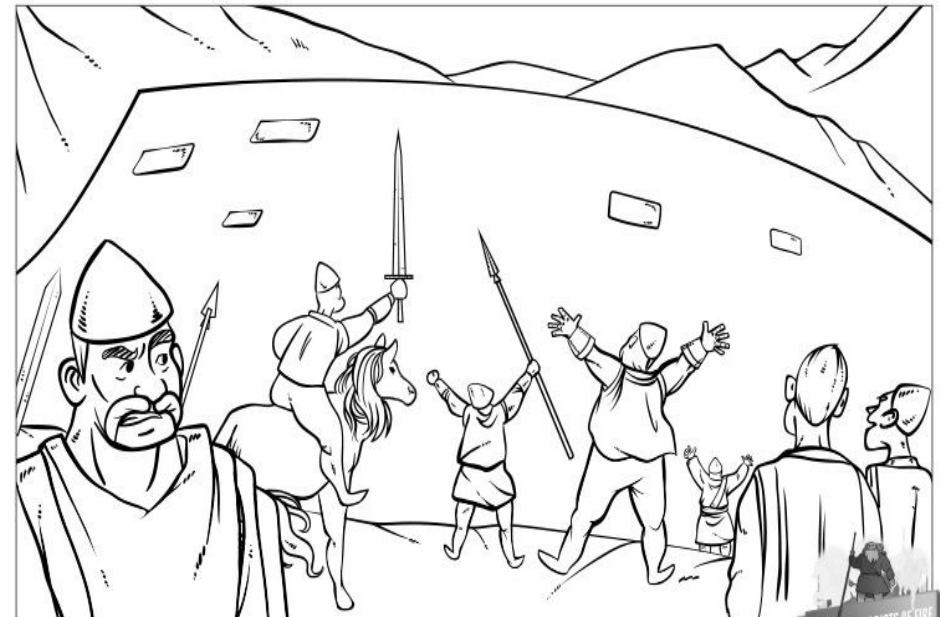
— And he prepared great provision for them: and when they had eaten and drunk, he sent them away, and they went to their master. So the bands of Syria came no more into the land of Israel.
